THE PASCAL TRIDUUM

The Pascal Triduum is the three days of Jesus' Passion ending Lent and moving us into the Easter Season. The Triduum begins on Maundy (Holy) Thursday and ends with Easter Day. These three days incorporate three (or four if some observe the Easter Eve Vigil) separate services that are actually part of one, whole worship service. Maundy (Holy) Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Eve Vigil, and Easter. There is no benediction (final blessing) on Maundy Thursday or Good Friday since these services are not concluded, but anticipate the next worship service as part of the whole three days of worship - The Pascal Triduum.

Maundy Thursday

Maundy Thursday begins our worship with Corporate confession and Absolution. The focus for this part of the Triduum is on Jesus and the disciples celebrating the Passover - His Last Supper with His disciples. It is from within the Passover that Jesus instituted and gave us His Holy Supper. It was here that Jesus washed the feet of His followers and taught them (and us) humility and service to one another. The celebration of the Sacrament of the Altar bestows the grace of God and the forgiveness of our sins upon us which was won by Christ on the cross. We conclude this worship part of the Triduum with the stripping of the Altar in preparation for Christ's death and burial on Friday.

TRIDUUM

Good Friday

Good Friday carries on the Triduum with a noon service and in the evening we have a Tenebrae service - a service of darkness. This is a day of joy as we remember the sacrifice Jesus made for us on the cross. This service is not a funeral service, but we do worship with restrained joy and minimized music. It is, after all, GOOD Friday - good for us, that is, as our sins were paid for by Jesus. We leave this day of the Triduum in silent, somber, joyful reflection of the God/Man's death in our place, and anticipate the unrestrained joy of Easter Day when we gather to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord.

Easter Eve Vigil

In some churches, the Vigil of Easter is celebrated. The vigil is a "keeping watch" through the night in anticipation of Jesus' resurrection early on Sunday. A worship service on Saturday evening may end the Triduum with the benediction and the Easter Acclamation, "Christ is Risen!" When the Vigil is observed, this would then begin the Easter season for those worshiping and keeping the vigil. Worshipers gather on this evening in expectation for the news of Christ's resurrection. Some churches in our area do have Easter Vigil services.

Easter Morning

Easter does certainly bring the Triduum to a joyful and glorious conclusion. The resurrection of our Lord means nothing without His death in the sinner's place. And His death would mean nothing without His resurrection to life and His victory over the grave, sin, and the devil. He is Risen, indeed.

IF YOU HAVE NEVER TAKEN PART IN ALL OF THE HOLY WEEK SERVICES, I ENCOURAGE YOU TO TRY THEM OUT THIS YEAR - You have to go through Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday in order to get to Easter Morning.

- 4/14 Maundy Thursday 7pm we walk with our Lord and Join Him at the Last Supper
- 4/15 Good Friday noon We consider the suffering of our Lord
- 4/15 Good Friday 7pm TENEBRAE a service of darkness as we contemplate the suffering and death of Jesus....
- 4/16 SAT NO WORSHIP SERVICE
- 4/17 EASTER SUNDAY 6, 9, 11am Celebrate our Lord's Resurrection.

During our midweek services we have been walking with Jesus - the "Places of the Passion" Continue walking with Jesus throughout Holy Week!

May God bless this time of worship as we receive His gracious blessings in Christ Jesus - our Savior and our Lord.

No Care is Too Small for Jesus

Jesus withdrew from the disciples about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed, saying, "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me. Nevertheless, not my will, but yours, be done." And there appeared to him an angel from heaven, strengthening him. And being in agony he prayed more earnestly; and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground. Lk. 22:40-43

Lent is a season where we intentionally focus on prayer and fasting. In Luke 22:40-43, we see Jesus praying. He is praying to God the Father to remove the cup of wrath from Him, but at the same time, the Father's will be done. Jesus knew He had to go to the cross to redeem mankind from slavery to sin, death, and the Devil. (Lk. 9:21-22, Lk. 9:43-45, Lk 18:31-34) So, why did He pray to the Father to remove this cup from Him knowing that this was the will of the Father for Him? What does it mean for us to pray to "Our Father, who art in heaven?"



Luther writes in the Small Catechism, "God would thereby with this little introduction tenderly urge us to believe that He is our true Father, and that we are His true children, so that we may ask Him confidently with all assurance, as dear children ask their dear father." Jesus came to the Father and His Son with full assurance of the Father's love for Him. This love of the Father brought Jesus into this world to free the world from sin, death, and the power of the Devil. Jesus has no death wish to go to the cross, but humbly accepts the cross as the Father's will for Him. When we pray, we can earnestly come before God with all of our hurts, cares, and concerns. This world is full of them. None are too small or too insignificant for the Father's attention. Our heavenly Father loves and cares for us. God is indeed omniscient – He already knows what you are going through, but He bids us to pray so that we trust in Him for all things. As a child obeys his or her parents, so too, when we pray obey our Lord when He commands us to pray in the 2nd commandment. Prayer shows where we go to for all of our meaning, purpose, and security in this life. Even if we don't pray, God's kingdom will continue to advance, and His will be done on heaven and on earth even without our participation. When we pray, we pray to make all the petitions in the Lord's Prayer true among us as well. Prayer is a living and active conversation with God that has been established through our great high priest Jesus Christ.

For we celebrate this Lenten season, the depths to which Christ won our freedom – freedom to pray, freedom to talk to God, freedom to put all our cares and anxieties on Him. This freedom was won on the cross where our Lord took the wrath of the Father on our behalf – where justice and mercy meet. Here, Christ intercedes for the whole world crying the Psalms on the cross. Pray with freedom. Pray with joy. Our Lord wants us to talk to Him, to put all our hurts and pains on Him, to trust in Him fully with both our hearts and our mouths. "Out of the depths I cry to you oh Lord," (Ps. 130:1), "Come, Lord Jesus!" (Rev. 22:20)
