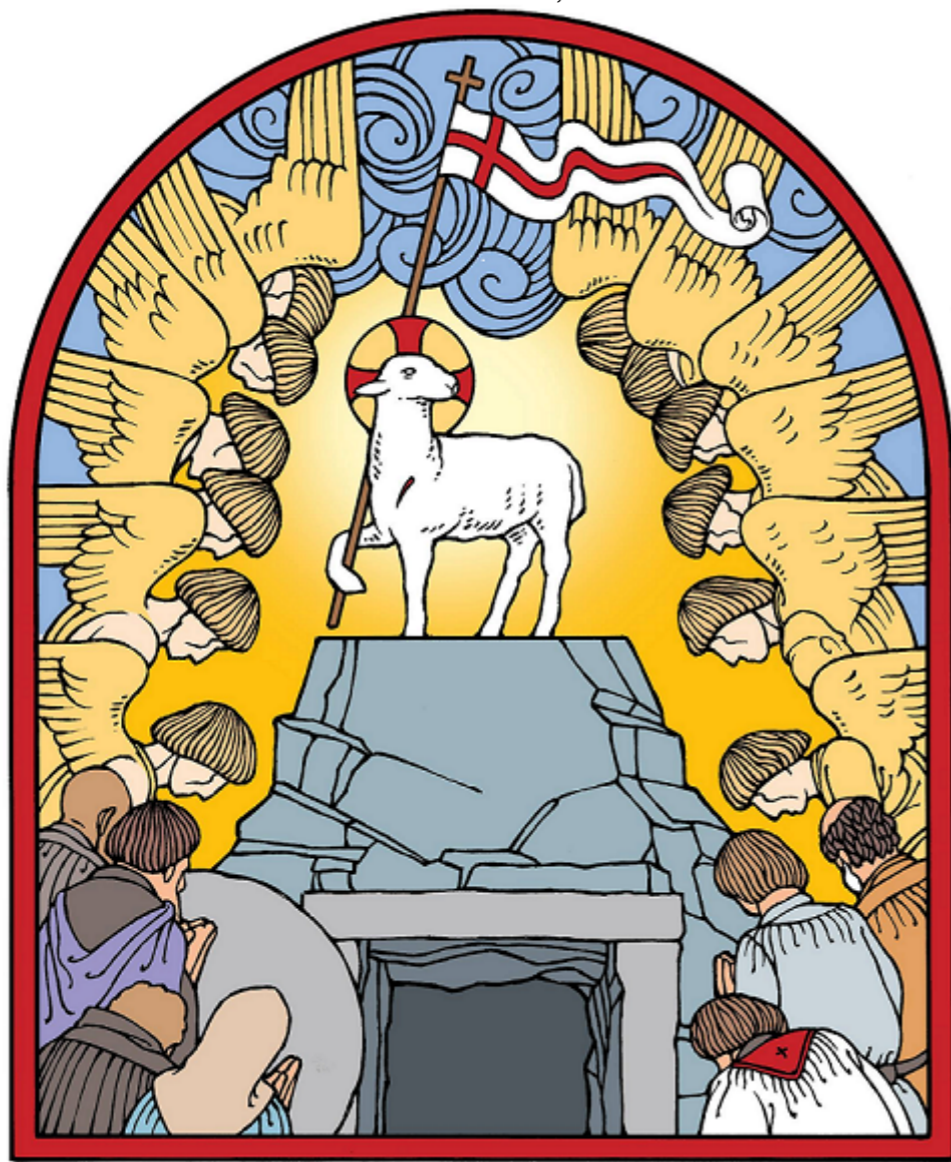

..... WORSHIP NOTES

Communion: *The Lord's Supper - The Real Presence

We come to the Lord's Table because we have sinned and want the Lord's assurance of His forgiveness of our sins as well as His strength for living the New Life of His Resurrection. As we eat the bread and drink the wine, because Jesus says so, we also receive His very Body and Blood. Doing this in repentant faith we receive His forgiveness. Along with God's forgiveness, comes the repentant New Life. In that New Life, we seek and use His power to overcome sinful ways and forsake them, including any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. We also strive to be faithful in regular worship and in attendance at the Lord's Table. Only in such faith do we properly and profitably receive the Sacrament and not misuse it to our judgment.

Fellow confirmed Christians of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod are welcome to share this sacrament with us. Prompted by love and caring, we ask that our other guests please speak with a pastor or lay minister before communing.

NOTE: If you are allergic or cannot drink full strength wine, the two (2) cups in the center of each tray have water with a drop or two of wine.

Note About Attendance Cards...Remember that the only way we may know you are worshiping with us is by seeing your name on an attendance card. These cards may be completed as you enter for worship and will be collected after the offering. Use one card for each family that is gathered. ***Please list the name of each person in worship.*** (Parents, please take responsibility for signing in your children) There is a "Member" side as well as a "Guest" side. Please fill out the appropriate side and pass them to the center aisle during the gathering of the offerings. The cards are gathered after the offering has been collected.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

P: On this All Saints' Sunday, we are also reminded of the overflowing grace of God, our heavenly Father. He sent His only-begotten Son to become one of us to die for us. Because of Christ's sacrifice on the cross, God has declared us to be His holy saints, His totally forgiven sons and daughters. We rejoice to be numbered with the saints. In today's Epistle, John writes, "*See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God.*" Yet, we do not live our lives as if we are children of God. In confidence, let us come before our gracious Lord to confess our sins and to receive His gracious forgiveness.
(Silence for reflection)

P: Father in heaven,

C: Forgive us for not always living in ways that honor Your name. You lavishly love us, but we have not shown love for You or for our neighbor. Because we are by nature sinful and unclean, we set our minds only on the things of this world and not on the world to come. Almighty God,

have mercy upon us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life. Amen.

P: Because of the sacrifice of His beloved Son for the sins of all people, God has promised His forgiveness. As God's called servant, it is with great joy that I announce God's grace to you. In His stead and at His command, I announce to you that your sins are forgiven, in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Thanks be to God. Amen!

P: Let us pray. . . Almighty and everlasting God, You knit together Your faithful people of all times and places into one holy communion, the mystical body of Your Son, Jesus Christ.

C: Grant us Your strength that we may follow Your blessed saints in all godly living that, together with them, we may come to the unspeakable joys You have prepared for those who love You; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, Amen.

First Lesson: Revelation 7:9-17

(A View Of Eternity)

After this I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell

down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying: "Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!" Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes - who are they, and where did they come from?" I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore, "they are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will spread his tent over them. Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. The sun will not beat upon them, nor any scorching heat. For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd; he will lead them to springs of living water. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Second Lesson: 1 John 3:1-10 *(The Blessing Of Being God's Children)*

How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when he appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. Everyone who has this hope in him purifies himself, just as he is pure. Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness. But you know that he appeared so that he might take away our sins. And in him is no sin. No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who continues to sin has either seen him or known him. Dear children, do not let anyone lead you astray. He who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous. He who does what is sinful is of the devil, because the devil has been sinning from the beginning. The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work. No one who is born of God will continue to sin, because God's seed remains in him; he cannot go on sinning, because he has been born of God. This is how we know who the children of God are and who the children of the devil are: Anyone who does not do what is right is not a child of God; nor is anyone who does not love his brother.

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

P: Let us confess our faith using Luther's explanation to the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed:

All: I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

PRAYERS OF GOD'S PEOPLE

P: Let us pray, . . . On this day we remember with thanksgiving those who have gone before us with the sign of faith. May their memory be blessed among us, and may we follow our Lord faithfully all our days. Lord, in Your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

P: With thankfulness for the land in which we live, we ask Your blessing on our nation, its leaders, and all who work for security and a sense of community in our world and in our lives. May we cherish the freedoms we enjoy and do all in our power to maintain the public good and promote peace and harmony. Lord, in Your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

P: O Lord, we pray for the sick, the sorrowing, and all who this day are in need of our prayers. We pray that you be with those hospitalized this past week (*Especially, . . .*). Also be with those who continue treatment and healing at

home. We pray for them and all those that we name in our hearts . . . (*Silence*). O Lord, May their petitions be answered according to Your good and gracious will, and may they be supported by this fellowship of saints. Lord, in Your mercy,

C: hear our prayer.

(Additional prayers of the congregation. Each petition concludes with. . .)

P: . . . Lord, In Your Mercy,

C: Hear Our Prayer.

P: Above all we praise and thank You for Your saving Word and for Your Son's body and blood, which You give us to eat and drink in the Sacrament. Through these means of grace, You send the Holy Spirit into our hearts, and unite us to Jesus and to the whole Christian Church on earth and in heaven.

C: Strengthen us through this heavenly food; increase our trust in Christ and our love for one another. Amen
