STEWARDS LIVING WITH PURPOSE

This is the first week of our stewardship emphasis Stewards Living with Purpose. Our theme for this week is "Do All to the Glory of God." "So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God" (1 Corinthians 10:31). How devoted are we to give God the glory that He deserves? "SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY"

When: Every Sunday at 9:50 am Location: Room 131

Nearly 50 years ago, the majority faculty of Concordia Seminary St. Louis, "walked out" of the campus cancelling classes and creating a new seminary - Christ Seminary in Exile - later abbreviated as "Seminex" after President John Tietjen was suspended by Synod. The clash between the modernist majority faculty and the confessional wing of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, called the "Battle for the Bible," was a long time coming. The seeds of The Walkout were laid decades before after World War II and matured in the late 1960s and early 1970s. The issues at stake were the inerrancy and inspiration of Scripture, the nature of the Gospel in relation to Scripture, use of the Law in the life of a Christian, etc.

Pastor Drinnon will be leading a Bible Study where we will be exploring both the history leading up to The Walkout and the biblical and theological positions of the modernists and how the Missouri Synod responded to challenges regarding the authority of Scripture, inerrancy, and the nature of the Gospel itself. The issues created by The Walkout continue to be relevant in the 21st century. The purpose of this Bible study is to equip you to confess the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15). All are invited to attend.
