
# St. Paul's Lutheran Church and School Announcements - November 9th & 10th

#### **GERMANY & ALPINE TOUR**

Once again, Pastor Don Balgeman, with the help of his brother Bill, is leading a tour to Germany. Some of the sites visited on this 11-day trip will include Munich, Rothenburg (an original medieval town), Nurnberg, Worms (Martin Luther historical site), Heidelberg, Augsburg (as in the Augsburg Confession), a Rhine River day-trip cruise, the Black Forest, Linderhof Castle, and the Passion Play Theater in Oberammergau. The trip is from August 31st to September 10th, 2025. All transportation, entrance fees, and a full-time guide are included, as well as all breakfasts and 6 of 9 dinners in Germany. 


#### ANNIVERSARY THANKOFFERINGS


#### **FAMILY SUNDAY SCHOOL**
