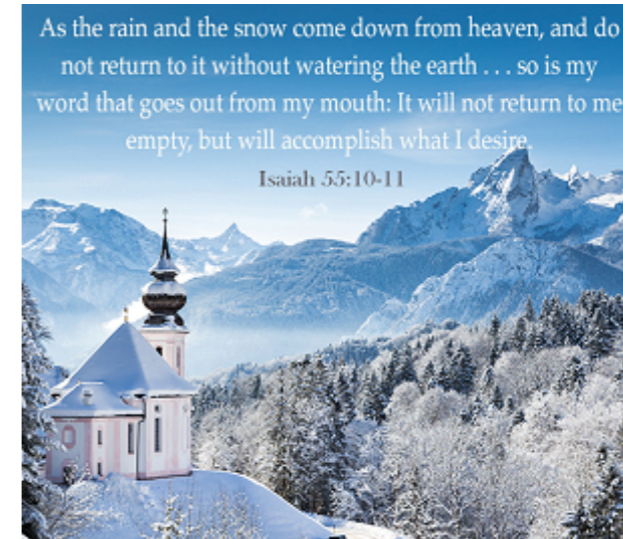
Please join Pastor Koeppen on **Saturday, January 25th at 7:30 am** in the Riverside cafeteria to study God's Word over coffee and breakfast.
