<u>NEW ADULT BIBLE STUDY</u> *"LECTURES IN GENESIS" Teacher: Pastor Drinnon When: 2nd & 4th Thursdays, 6:00 pm*

I am excited to announce an upcoming Bible study on the Book of Genesis, **beginning February 27**th. This study offers a profound opportunity to deepen our understanding of God's creation, His covenant with His people, and the foundational truths of our Christian faith.

Why study Genesis? Genesis is the first book of the Bible and holds a unique place in both the Old and New Testaments. It is filled with profound theological insights, rich narratives, and timeless lessons. From the creation of the world, to the fall of humanity, to God's promises to Abraham and the patriarchs, Genesis sets the stage for the entire biblical account. It is here that we first encounter God's sovereignty, His justice, and His mercy—elements that are essential to understanding the Gospel. Throughout this study, we will:

- Explore the creation account and its theological and Christological significance.
- Dive into the stories of Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph.
- Discuss the implications of original sin, the promise of redemption, and God's ongoing faithfulness.
- Reflect on how Genesis relates to our lives today especially in the light of humanistic rationalism and how the accounts in Genesis point forward to the fulfillment found in Christ.

Materials: The study will utilize the ESV Illuminated Scripture Journal: Genesis to write notes in to take with you beyond the classroom. You can order one yourself on Amazon or email Pastor Drinnon to order you one. Please bring your Bible, your Illuminated Scripture Journal, and a heart ready to dive deep into God's Word.

All are welcome! Whether you're new to Bible study or have been studying the Scriptures for years, this study is for you. Come, engage with us as we explore the ancient truths of Genesis that continue to shape our faith and our understanding of God. JANUARY VOTERS MEETING SUMMARY

The Voters Assembly met on Sunday, January 19, 2025. Business and information items were light.

Agenda action items as follows:

- Lay Ministry Member changes were approved (New members accepted and those being released from membership and transferring to another church).
- **Nominations Committee** is being formed for elections in May.
- Financial Review Committee appointments were made.
- Downtown School Name Proposal -There was a request to re-name the old school and gym, at the downtown site to "St. Paul's Mission and Ministry Center." The request was approved. This is a result of recognizing the great amount of mission and ministry that is already occurring as well as the future mission and ministry opportunities that we are pursuing at that site. Currently, there are 16 different ministries that use the downtown church and school location. Twelve of those ministries are using the old school and gym buildings and two of those have started within the last year. In order to expand our ministry in those buildings, there will need to complete some much needed repairs and updates to those facilities. Currently, there is a group that is reaching out to area LCMS congregations and researching grants

(From the Northern Illinois District and Synod) to help fund those repairs.
