LERT DISASTER RELIEF TRAINING

St. Paul's is working to build a team to provide disaster relief when it happens in our area. We invite you to join our team but training is needed to deploy. There is a local training at Trinity Lutheran Church in New Lenox on March 15th from 9 am to 1 pm. Please consider attending LCMS LERT (Lutheran Early Response Team) volunteer training offered by Lutheran Church Charities. Federal guidelines indicate that volunteers responding to a disaster should be trained and certified. Should a disaster strike, you could deploy to a disaster site and serve those affected in a church and community. This training will prepare LERT team members for credentialing and will focus on the safety, work, and ministry of Lutherans as Early Responders. This training is part of a Synod-wide disaster response program, facilitated by a national network of District Disaster Response Coordinators and Teams. After the training, you will receive a certificate, ID badge, manual, vest and a T-shirt. In the chaos of disaster, it's important to stay focused on the task at hand. This training will help you focus on the most important thing to remember as you prepare for or to respond to a disaster in your community or beyond. VOTERS MEETING SUMMARY

The Voters Assembly met on January 19th. Business and information items were light. Agenda action items as follows:

- Lay Ministry Member changes were approved (New members, releases, and transfers).
- Nominations Committee is being formed for elections in May.
- Financial Review Committee appointments were made.
- Downtown School Name Proposal -There was a request to re-name the old school and gym at the downtown site to "St. Paul's Mission and Ministry Center." The request was approved. This is a result of recognizing the great amount of mission and ministry that is already occurring as well as the future mission and ministry opportunities that we are pursuing at that site. Currently, there are 16 different ministries that use the downtown church and school location - 12 of those ministries are using the old school and gym buildings and 2 have started within the last year. In order to expand our ministry in those buildings, there will need to complete some much needed repairs and updates to those facilities. Currently, there is a group that is reaching out to area LCMS congregations and researching grants (From the Northern Illinois District and Synod) to help fund those repairs.
