Upside-Down Actions as You Gather at Church this Easter Weekend

In our Resurrected King's Kingdom, the values are often opposite of this world. We have been included in what many refer to as an upside-down Kingdom where the weak are strong, the first are last, and the servants are the greatest among us. As we celebrate our King's defeat of death when we celebrate Easter this month, here are some upside-down actions you can take that will serve others as they celebrate Easter. These are more practical than profound. They are all really simple, but they are also more helpful than you may realize.

- 1. Make Room for Visitors - Since visitors may not know everything about worshiping at St. Paul's, make room for them. Leave the parking spots in front of church open for the visitors so first-time guests can easily find a spot.
- 2. Sit closer - This action combines perfectly with the previous one. Get even more steps in and walk as close to the front as you can. By sitting close, you make it easier for those who arrive after you to find a seat, and you have the opportunity to set the pace in singing, listening, and celebrating that Jesus is alive.
- 3. Sing louder - It may feel normal to sing softer when you're surrounded by more people than normal and by people who are not usually in the section where you're seated. Do the not-normal thing. Sing louder because your singing will encourage others. As visitors hear our singing, they may think: "Wow, these people must really believe this, listen to them sing!" Do that.

4. Choose the least popular worship service time to attend - - we have three different services on Easter morning. The 9am tends to be the best attended service, so why not try the 6am or the 11am to make room for our visitors? Of course, if you have friends coming with you who don't normally come to church, then come to the service that works best for them.

Most of all, enjoy church on Easter and on every weekend! You are part of a Kingdom that will not be shaken, one that will last forever because your King has overcome sin and death. We can be thankful with glad and sincere hearts because He is alive.

Well, . . . what do you think? Why not try making room for our visitors and even taking the time to invite a friend to join us in worship? Remember all the services that we have as we head into Easter! Join us for them all and walk with Jesus during Holy Week and rejoice as we proclaim that Christ is risen indeed!

IF YOU HAVE NEVER TAKEN PART IN ALL OF THE HOLY WEEK SERVICES WE OFFER, I ENCOURAGE YOU TO TRY THEM OUT THIS YEAR - You have to go through Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday in order to get to Easter Morning.

- 4/17 Maundy Thursday 7pm we walk with our Lord and Join Him at the Last Supper
- 4/18 Good Friday noon We consider the suffering of our Lord
- 4/18 Good Friday 7pm TENEBRAE a service of darkness as we contemplate the suffering and death of Jesus....
- 4/19 SAT NO WORSHIP SERVICE
- 4/20 EASTER SUNDAY 6, 9, 11am Celebrate our Lord's Resurrection.

A Joyous Lent

And behold, now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground, which you, O Lord, have given me.' And you shall set it down before the Lord your God and worship before the Lord your God. And you shall rejoice in all the good that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house, you, and the Levite, and the sojourner who is among you.

Deuteronomy 26:10-11

I have grown to not like how Lent is commonly celebrated or portrayed. Often, Lent is about what *I* give up. *I* am giving up chocolate for Lent. *I* am giving up ice cream for Lent. Lent becomes about *me*. Lent becomes about *my* sin.

I want to propose something that may sound odd. I propose that Lent is really a season of joy. I was inspired to think of Lent this way after reading the Old Testament reading for the First Sunday in Lent in the lectionary. Deuteronomy 26 seems to be a reading more appropriate for a stewardship sermon than an introspective reading we would expect. And then there is the word rejoice right there in the reading. Why should we have joy in Lent?


The joy of a Christian never leaves even during the penitential season such as Lent. The joy never leaves us even on Good Friday. The joy is just a reserved joy as we mediate and ponder all what our Lord went through to save us from our sins. There are four reasons why we can have joy in the Lenten season.

- Lent is a season where we **repent** with joy. We can repent with joy because we have a good and gracious God who will always forgive us when we come to Him. In my experience, there is not a lot of joy going to someone and saying you are sorry knowing that they will never forgive you. We can have joy in Lent because our Lord lavishly forgives us our sin.
- Lent is a season where we **release** with joy. The reading in Deuteronomy 26 is about offering your first fruits to the Lord. When farmers offer their first fruits to the Lord, they are releasing control of the most important crop of the year and commending their crop to the Lord. We too are called to give our first fruits to the Lord whether those first fruits are the time we spend volunteering on the various boards and ministries at St. Paul's; the talent we give in various ways; the treasure that God gives to us. Lent is a time to joyously release control and commend our lives to Him.
- Lent is a season where we **return** to the Lord with joy. Every worship service is an opportunity to return to the Lord. No matter how long you have been away, God always

- welcomes you back into relationship with Him. We also get to invite others to return with joy knowing that we have a good and gracious God who loves and cares for our neighbor and wishes to see them receive the forgiveness of sins through Jesus Christ.
- Finally, Lent is a season where we **remember.** We get to reflect on all the things our Lord has done for us. We get to remember the story. The story where our good and gracious God created us; we fell into sin; He sent His Son in the flesh to save us from sin; He went to the cross to die for us; He rose from the dead for us. The more we are in church this season. The more we hear the Word. The more we will get out of that message that Easter morning.

The season of Lent is a journey. Lent is an opportunity to refocus on what matters most Jesus. Fasting is an excellent spiritual discipline in order to do this, but do not let the fasting become a focus on *me*, *my* righteousness, *my* works. Instead, when we **repent**, **release**, **return**, **and remember**, Lent is a season of joy. Keep that joy with you from cross to grave to empty tomb. I look forward to Easter where we will say together – Christ is risen. He is risen indeed alleluia!

On February 27th, Pastor Drinnon started a new Bible study on the Book of Genesis. This study will meet again on **Thursday**, **April 10th**. It offers a profound opportunity to deepen our understanding of God's creation, His covenant with His people, and the foundational truths of our Christian faith.

Why study Genesis? Genesis is the first book of the Bible and holds a unique place in both the Old and New Testaments. It is filled with profound theological insights, rich narratives, and timeless lessons. From the creation of the world, to the fall of humanity, to God's promises to Abraham and the patriarchs, Genesis sets the stage for the entire biblical account. It is here that we first encounter God's sovereignty, His justice, and His mercy—elements that are essential to understanding the Gospel.

Throughout this study, we will:

• Explore the creation account and its theological and Christological significance.

- Dive into the stories of Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph.
- Discuss the implications of original sin, the promise of redemption, and God's ongoing faithfulness.
- Reflect on how Genesis relates to our lives today especially in the light of humanistic rationalism and how the accounts in Genesis point forward to the fulfillment found in Christ.

Materials: The study utilizes the ESV Illuminated Scripture Journal: Genesis to write notes in to take with you beyond the classroom. You can order one yourself on Amazon or email Pastor Drinnon to order you one. Please bring your Bible, your Illuminated Scripture Journal, and a heart ready to dive deep into God's Word.

All are welcome! Whether you're new to Bible study or have been studying the Scriptures for years, this study is for you. Come, engage with us as we explore the ancient truths of Genesis that continue to shape our faith and our understanding of God. "ROAD TO CORONATION"


