
SAVE THE DATE!!!



When: 2nd & 4th Thursdays, 6:00 pm Why study Genesis? Genesis is the first book of the Bible and holds a unique place in both the Old and New Testaments. It is filled with profound theological insights, rich narratives, and timeless lessons. From the creation of the world, to the fall of humanity, to God's promises to Abraham and the patriarchs, Genesis sets the stage for the entire biblical account. It is here that we first encounter God's sovereignty, His justice, and His mercy—elements that are essential to understanding the Gospel.

Throughout this study, we will:

- Explore the creation account
- Dive into the stories of Adam & Eve, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph.
