#### \*Communion: The Lord's Supper - A Reverent Sacrament

The Apostle Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 11:27,29, "Anyone who eats the bread or drinks the Lord's cup in an unworthy way is guilty of sinning against the Lord's body and blood. Anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the Lord's body brings judgment on himself as he eats and drinks." In view of the serious nature of the Lord's Supper, Paul commands us to examine ourselves to see if we are partaking the supper for the purposes for which Christ instituted with our hearts properly prepared. We heartily invite Confirmed members of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod to receive of the Lord's Supper. Other guests, we ask you to see the pastor or lay minister first so that you may receive the supper to your benefit rather than to your harm as the Apostle Paul warns.

NOTE: If you are allergic or cannot drink full strength wine, The two (2) cups in the center of each tray have water with a drop or two of wine.

## THE READING OF THE WORD

Old Testament Lesson: Malachi 3:1-6

(I, The Lord, Do Not Change)

"Behold, I send my messenger and he will prepare the way before me. And the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple; and the messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, behold, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap. # <u>Rev. Dr. Joel C. Elowsky</u>

Dr. Joel Elowsky is Professor of Historical Theology at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, and Director of its Center for the Study of Early Christian Texts. He also serves as a researcher for the Center for Early African Christianity and has taught at the Seminary since 2014. His expertise includes early church studies, the history of exegesis, African Christianity, and mission work.

He holds degrees from Concordia Seminary (M.Div., S.T.M.), Drew University (M.Phil., Ph.D.), and Concordia University Ann Arbor (B.A.), and previously studied at Westfield House (Cambridge) and Concordia Lutheran Theological Seminary (Canada).

Elowsky has served in various academic and pastoral roles, including at Concordia University Wisconsin and Drew University, and was research director for the Ancient

Christian Commentary on Scripture. He has contributed extensively to patristic scholarship, editing or authoring works in the Ancient Christian Doctrine, Texts, and Devotional series, as well as the Encyclopedia of Ancient Christianity.

He has lectured widely, particularly in Africa and Europe, and participates in ecumenical dialogues, including Evangelicals and Catholics Together. He is president of the Institute for Classical Christian Studies and a board member of the China Academic Consortium.

Elowsky lives in St. Louis with his wife, Joy, a church musician. They have two sons, Christian and Luke. In his spare time, he enjoys sailing in northern Michigan.
