
SPECIAL VOTERS' MEETING SUMMARY

The Voters' Assembly met on Wed., July 16, 2025, with 50 voters in attendance.

At this special Voters' Meeting, there were a number of agenda items:

- Matching Funds Fund Raising Request - An anonymous individual has approached us with a matching fund challenge to help with our church and school ministry and our budget realities. Our generous donor has pledged to match up to \$100,000.00 of donations (\$50,000.00 for the General Fund and \$50,000.00 for the Building Fund) which will enable us to raise a total of \$200,000.00 to support St. Paul's Church and School. As of the Voters' Meeting, we have already had several other generous offers of additional \$1000 matching gifts for both the General and Building Funds. This fund raising opportunity was approved.
- 2025-2026 Budget The final item on the agenda was approval of the 2025-2026 budget which included the Matching Funds Fund Raiser as well as the Brinkmann Endowment Fund Transfer and the loan from the Organ Endowment Fund. The Budget and additional items were approved. With the approval of these items, the budget is basically balanced. While these are all great blessings, we realize that these are one-time solutions.
