#### **SAFE HARBOR!!**

I read a story about a ship captain and chaplain. Let me share it with you:

The captain of a large ship was a skeptic, a man who doubted the existence of heaven, the person of Christ, and many other doctrines of the Bible. After his retirement from active duty, he spent his declining years in a soldier's home. One day the chaplain, who was deeply concerned about this man's soul, surprised him with a challenge. Handing him a New Testament and a red pencil, he asked the man to mark everything that he could not believe.



Periodically, the chaplain would visit the man and would ask him if he had found anything to mark. The man never replied, only smiled. One morning the chaplain was informed that the captain had died suddenly during the night. The chaplain hurried to the room and found the Bible clutched in his hand, as he lay dead on his bed. The chaplain paged through the New Testament looking for red marks and found none.

Turning to John 3:16, he noted that the man had written in red pencil on the margin: "I have cast my anchor in a safe harbor; I am at peace, thank God." The truth of God's Word and the work of the Holy Spirit worked powerfully in his life. This captain, as he read, was given God's assurance of all that He had done for him in Jesus Christ. He knew those promises were his! It is no wonder that he could go to sleep in Jesus in true peace!

Those same blessings, and the same feeling of peace, can also belong to each one of us through faith in Jesus.

However, there are those who are at work against us. Our own sinful nature and the world seek to undermine our faith. The devil is hard at work as well.

- X The devil works hard to convince you that you are not worthy of the blessings you read about in the Bible.
- He works hard at convincing you that God cannot forgive the multitude of sins that you have committed.

X He will try his best to get you to turn your back on all that God has done for you.

But we have a Safe Harbor, don't we? Like the captain, as we continue steadfast in God's Word (reading, studying and memorizing), we see the truth of everything that Jesus has done for us. That reality moves us to rejoice in the wonderful salvation that Jesus has accomplished for us.

The Bible is the one book necessary in life. It tells you about God and His love for you. It alone will prepare you for eternal life. I pray that each one of you might continue to study and remember God's Word so that your faith might remain strong.

May the anchor of God's Word keep you safe as you battle the trials and tribulations of life. And may you long for that day when you can join Jesus in that "safe harbor" for all eternity!

### PERSEVERE WITH THANKSGIVING

Please mark your calendars as we close our anniversary year here at St. Paul's.

160th School Anniversary - Our closing SCHOOL anniversary service will take place at the school site on Sunday, August 24th at 10:00am. There will be a picnic afterwards as we rejoice in God's blessings!

165th Church Anniversary - Our closing CHURCH anniversary service will take place at the downtown church on Sunday, December 14th at 10:00am. There will be a reception in the fellowship hall afterwards.



Give as You Are Blessed (Guided by the Tithe) is the theme of our Stewardship emphasis for this year. The emphasis will begin on the weekend of September 20-21 and continue through October 5. During this time, we will grow in our understanding of what it means to give proportionately from all the wonderful blessings that God entrusts to us. God wants His people to give faithfully and generously. When we do, we mirror His nature which is to give. "For God so loved the world, that He gave..." (John 3:16). God provides our resources to give, and, by His grace, He gives us the desire to support His Church, help those in need, and advance His kingdom.

As always, we look to God's Word for guidance and wisdom as to what is an appropriate response to God for His faithfulness, love, and goodness to us. In the Old Testament, God commanded His followers to tithe (give a tenth of all income). As New Covenant Christians, we are not commanded to tithe. However, Jesus affirms the tithe when He encourages the Pharisees to continue their tithing while not forgetting the vitally important heart issues of justice, mercy, and faith (Matthew 23:23). The tithe is a meaningful Biblical guide to determine the proportionate amount to give from God's blessings. Giving will often start with giving less than the tithe and move toward the tithe and beyond.

God calls us to give as He blesses us. (1 Corinthians 16:2). God works through us, as believers, to fund His Church, provide for the needs of others, and to support the extension of His kingdom financially. Much more than our money, God wants us to love Him with all our hearts, souls, minds, and strength (Matthew 22:37). If we could love God in that way, Christian ministries and causes would never lack funding.

At the end of three weeks of sermons on God's blessings and giving, you will be challenged to put into practice the principles that have been discussed. Starting the week of October 6th, there will be a **TEN for TEN Giving Challenge** (ten percent for ten weeks). Our church families will be challenged to give a tithe (10 percent) OR to increase the portion of what they are giving for their weekly offerings for a period of ten weeks. God not only provides us the resources to give, He gives us the desire to give. Generous giving is one of the ways that faith-filled hearts respond to the riches of Christ.

Surveys have shown that about one in every five Lutheran church goers tithe. How is it possible to tithe and do it so freely and joyfully? Christ's love empowers us to give generously. It flows freely "as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us" (Eph. 5:2). Our generous giving to God is a response to Christ's love and willing sacrifice for us.

We give as we are blessed. We are to engage in tithing freely rather than to be required to tithe. By God's grace, many of us will begin to tithe for the first time. Tithing is a big step forward as we place our trust in the Lord. At the current time, tithing may not be for everyone. What may be possible for you is to take a leap of faith and increase the proportionate amount of your giving by one or two percent or even more during the **TEN** for **TEN** Giving Challenge.

As stated previously, the emphasis will begin on the weekend of September 20-21. We will have three weeks of sermon messages and Bible studies followed by the TEN for TEN Giving Challenge (ten percent for ten weeks). When you receive the commitment form for this ten-week challenge, seek God's guidance as to what He wants you be giving now and in the future. Commitment Sunday is the weekend of October 4-5.


As we give, we will experience the joy of giving, and understand more fully why Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

#### **GROWTH IN GOD'S GARDEN**

My wife Katrina and I have a big garden. We grow everything from tomatoes and watermelon to strawberries and eggplant. And like any garden, it takes time, effort, and care to grow well.





#### 1. Growth Has a Goal.

Each garden bed has a purpose. Wild, aimless growth hurts the garden. Spiritually, our goal is clear: "We are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells" (2 Peter 3:13). We grow toward that goal through the finished work of Christ. You are planted with purpose by God—where you are, as you are. He has a plan for you.

#### 2. Growth Grasps the Word.

Growth means learning new things. Our garden has changed over the years—and so has our understanding of Scripture. Peter acknowledges that some parts of the Bible are hard to understand (2 Peter 3:16), but that shouldn't stop us. You don't need to know Greek to read your Bible! We have opportunities to grow in the Lord through divine service and Bible study. As we grow, God's Word takes on new depth and meaning in every season of life.

#### 3. Growth Must Be Guarded.

Just like pests threaten a garden, false teaching and sin threaten our faith. Peter warns us to be on guard (2 Peter 3:17). We must protect our spiritual growth from the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh.

As Peter concludes: "Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and forever!" (2 Peter 3:18)

Let us grow in Christ—purposefully, faithfully, and with our eyes fixed on the goal. May your summer be fun and fruitful in the Lord.







#### SPECIAL VOTERS' MEETING SUMMARY

The Voters' Assembly met on Wednesday, July 16, 2025, with 50 voters in attendance.

At this special Voters' Meeting, there were a number of agenda items:

Matching Funds Fund Raising Request - An anonymous individual has approached us with a matching fund challenge to help with our church and school ministry and our budget realities. Our generous donor has pledged to match up to \$100,000.00 of donations (\$50,000.00 for the General Fund and \$50,000.00 for the Building Fund) which will enable us to raise a total of \$200,000.00 to support St. Paul's Church and School.

As of the Voters' Meeting, we have already had several other generous offers of additional \$1000 matching gifts for both the General and Building Funds.

This fund raising opportunity was approved.

- 2025-2026 Budget The final item on the agenda was approval of the 2025-2026 budget which included the Matching Funds Fund Raiser as well as the Brinkmann Endowment Fund Transfer and the loan from the Organ Endowment Fund.
  - With the approval of these items, the budget is basically balanced. While these are all great blessings, we realize that these are one-time solutions.

The Budget and additional items were approved.

# "PETER'S JOYFUL PERSEVERANCE"

Early in I Peter writing to the persecuted, martyred church, Peter wrote in I Peter 1:6-7, "So be truly glad. There is wonderful joy ahead, even though you must endure many trials for a little while. These trials will show that your faith is genuine. It is being tested as fire tests and purifies gold - though your faith is far more precious than mere gold. So when your faith remains strong through many trials, it will bring you much praise and glory and honor on the day when Jesus Christ is revealed to the whole world."

This was true in the 1<sup>st</sup> century and it is still true in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. A sinful

world challenges our faith every day and Christians suffer for the sake of knowing Jesus. So Peter hasn't changed his message and God's Word can help us understand why this world has reached a precarious position. Peter says that suffering makes our faith grow and mature.

In addition to studying I & II Peter, we will look at impulsive Peter's New Testament life - he is always the first to volunteer, the one to walk on water, the one suggesting that they build three shelters for the Tranfiguration participants.

Roy will be teaching the lesson new on Tuesdays and then repeat it on Sundays. Class will start on Tuesday, August 12<sup>th</sup> in Fellowship Hall and on Sunday, August 17<sup>th</sup> at the school. The course will meet in its first half from August to Sunday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> and then resume on Tuesday, January 6<sup>th</sup> until Sunday April 26<sup>th</sup>.

Please bring your Bible or have access to the Bible on your cell phone. There will be just a few special study handouts, but no regulars ones, no videos, no tapes, just a straight through study of I & II Peter verse by verse, chapter by chapter. Sidetracks to Peter's life as a disciple will be a part of each week's discussion. You can't make it on Tuesday? Come on Sunday. You don't want to stay for Bible study on Sunday? Join us on Tuesday!

Pastor Koeppen is leading a new Bible Study entitled "Know Thy Enemy". Using clips from the movie, Nefarious, we will

consider the work and influence of Satan. The movie has been described as "The Screwtape Letters on steroids." In that momentous work on demonic influence, author C.S. Lewis warned about the twin traps we fall into when it comes to acknowledging evil: "There are two equal and opposite errors into which our race can fall about the devils. One is to disbelieve in their existence. The other is to believe, and to feel an excessive and unhealthy interest in them."

We live in a world in which there is more danger in underestimating the influence of evil in our culture than over-emphasizing it. Evidence of the spiritual battle is everywhere. Let's face it, few people want to be in a battle. As followers of Christ, however, we're in the middle of a conflict that has been raging for thousands of years - whether we know it or not. Thus, it is critical for us to know the eternal stakes.

And so, you need to know your enemy. Together, we will take a deeper look

at the truth about Satan, demons, and the pervasive evil from the unseen realm that has manifested in our culture today. Yes, those are dark subjects, but they're also critical for us as children of God.

This study will help you to understand the times and to examine everything we've been given in Christ to stand courageous and firm against the forces of evil. As the Scriptures tell us 365 times, "fear not." In fact, through the truth of who we are in Christ and the armor He has made available to us, we can stand confidently against the Enemy's snares and schemes.
