Of course the bestselling book in the world is *The Holy Bible*. Here at St. Paul's, there are always adult Bible studies on Sunday morning, and some during the week throughout the year. If you only attend two church services a month and do Bible studies, then you use 3.6% of your time in God's Word. If you only attend church, have no personal devotions and do not attend any Bible studies, you are at 1.1% of your time walking and talking with the Lord. Remember the more we give God, the more we receive from Him.

Here is another challenge for you in addition to our congregation's *Ten for Ten.* Why not try to be at least a 4% participant for the next few weeks? I am sure God will love it and who knows? Maybe you will too!


VETERANS' DAY CHAPEL

Agenda actions items as follows:

- Lay Ministry Membership changes were approved.
- The Treasurer discussed the summary of the School Financial Review with the Voters.
- Mission & Ministry Update. Sarah Cherry gave an update of the Grant process for help with repairs at the downtown Mission & Ministry Center. They have submitted the grant to the Northern Illinois District to help update the Mission & Ministry Center. They will hopefully receive an answer in December. They are also getting ready to apply for Synodical grants for the Mission & Ministry Center.
- NEW BUSINESS
 - Forum Delegates Pastor Drinnon and Brent Eden were approved as Pastoral and Lay Delegates to the Circuit Forum where the circuit will elect Pastoral and Lay Delegates to attend the Synodical Convention in 2026.
 - Housing Allowance approval for our Called Workers. The voters approved an amended 2025 Housing allowance. Total for 2025 is \$176,998.76 (an increase of \$3,000.00) The voters also approved the 2026 housing allowances for a total of \$179,870.00.
