God in His incomparable love has made a way for us through the wilderness. He did this by giving us His Son, our Light in the darkness. In *Born to You ... a Savior*, we embrace the Christmas joy and wonder of Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.

At Christ's birth, God the Father did a new and everlasting thing in our lives: He gave us His one and only Son for our redemption. In divine humility, Jesus joined us as a human being. Born of a woman, bearing the sins of the world, Jesus comes to us as our Protector, our Deliverer, our Savior.

"The Quiet and Wonder of Advent"

How noisy is the world in which you live?

Some people like a lot of noise. During the summer when our windows are open, we can hear trains as they pass through the area. We also hear cars as they come down the street - actually, we don't hear the car - we hear the music playing in the car even when they're still a block away. How come? Because the radio is blasting so loud! I always wonder if the driver of the car will have much hearing left by the time they are my age.



In our noisy world, is there any room for quiet?

In our practical, scientific world, is there any room for mystery and wonder?

It is interesting that scientists seem to find plenty to wonder about both in the universe and in human behavior.

Is it foolishness to wonder what God had, or has, in mind for you and me? After all, no one can fathom the depths of God's full intent for us. However, the Biblical account of the Garden of Eden portrays what our world should be a place of beauty and peace. We know

how sin destroyed what God had so perfectly made. Life on earth became unraveled. Like a ball of yarn, played with by a child, it soon lay tangled on the floor. Life's vast potential for achievement and for joy was lost amidst the twisted strands; the beautiful garden only a memory.



As a result, our Creator saw that something needed to be done. As the One who originally brought order out of chaos at creation, God set about to do it again. This time, instead of a "spoken word", "THE Word" would enter into our tangled, hurting, chaotic world in human flesh.

The quiet and wonder of Advent is set right in the midst of one of our culture's noisiest seasons. In the midst of the chaos of December comes the reminder that He is coming . . . The Prince of Peace. He calls us to prepare a bed soft, undefiled, within our heart where the quiet and wonder of the Baby Jesus can bring peace, hope and joy.

God's love for sinners - for you and me - is certainly a wonder. The salvation He gives us brings to our life the quiet assurance that with His coming our foes of sin, death, and Satan are silenced.

May you know the quiet and wonder of the season and may your heart and life be richly touched this Advent and Christmas.

Meaningless? Meaningless?

What "does the worker gain from his toil? I have seen the burden God has laid on men. He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the hearts of men; yet they cannot fathom what God has done from beginning to end. I know that there is nothing better for men than to be happy and do good while they live. That everyone may eat and drink, and find satisfaction in all his toil-this is the gift of God. Ecclesiastes 3:9-13

The New Year is usually a time for reflection. A time to think about all the events and memories of the past year and also make some plans and look forward to the coming year. The book of Ecclesiastes is a great book to read through at this time of year. Ecclesiastes helps keep everything in perspective.

Solomon, one of the wisest men who has ever lived, wrote the book of Ecclesiastes. This book is a collection of his thoughts and musings as he looks back on life and asks heart-wrenching questions. Why am I here? What is the purpose of life? Where does God fit into all of this?

To be honest, the book of Ecclesiastes is not an uplifting book. It paints an honest picture of life and how meaningless it sometimes seems. Over and over again, Solomon writes, "Meaning less! Meaning less! Utterly meaning less! Everything is meaning less." As the years come and go, so many of the things that are so important to us at one time or another also come and go. And ultimately, all human beings face the same ending.... death.

As I think of the state of this world - all the wars, all the unrest, all the poverty, all the cancer and sickness, all the abuse, all the evil - it can be so easy to feel like there is no meaning in this world. I have seen good people die while others keep on living? And why?

The main point of Ecclesiastes is that we cannot understand and give meaning to all the events that happen in this world. To us, many things appear meaningless. Without God and the perspective He gives us in the Bible, there is very little meaning in this world.

Solomon concludes that, "[God] has made every thing be autiful in its time." We don't always understand how God does this, but we trust that God is at work redeeming and renewing his creation. We just celebrated how God has sent his own Son into this world. Into the midst of the darkness and despair, God took flesh and dwelt among us. Jesus Christ redeemed this world by offering his life in place of ours. Jesus died so that all who believe in him will receive life - life while here on earth and eternal life with God in heaven. God came to us to save us and to give us hope.

Solomon also shares this wisdom with us, "[God] has also set eternity in the hearts of men; yet they cannot fathom what God has done from beginning to end." One of the

greatest mysteries is that God has placed his image within us, a soul that will last for all eternity. God created us to have a relationship with him and to live with him forever. The truth is, we cannot understand why events happen the way they do. But we can always know that God is with us. Even in the midst of our good times and in our tragedies, we know that God is at work in our lives.

When I take the time to stop for a moment, it is so easy for me to see God at work at St. Paul's - at our Day School, in our Sunday School, in our mission projects, in our outreach, in our fellowship, and in our worship services. I see God touching lives through all of you as you reach out to those in need. I see a God who has a great future for His Church at St. Paul's. I know that God will continue to do amazing things through people like you and me who place their trust in Him.

I pray that this New Year is one that you experience God working in marvelous ways in your life. May the Lord open your hearts and your eyes to his hand at work in the midst of your life!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Every year as Christmas approaches, we hear again the familiar words: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." (John 1:14) We know them well, yet they strike us differently depending on the season we're living through. This year, many of us have felt the weight of perseverance—pressing on through long seasons of strain, uncertainty, and weariness. In sermons these past months, we've talked often about what it means to persevere: not in our own strength, but in the strength Christ provides.

Christmas, then, comes not as a sentimental distraction from hardship but as God's answer within it.

- The Child in the manger is not simply a symbol of hope; **He is Hope Himself**—God taking on our flesh so He can carry what we cannot. Christ does not call us to endure from a distance; He steps into the very world that exhausts us. He knows what it is to be burdened, to be pressed, to walk the long road of obedience. And because He has taken on our weakness, He promises to be our strength.
- When endurance feels like shoveling your driveway through deep snow, when faithfulness feels costly, when waiting feels endless, Christmas proclaims that God has drawn near. The Savior who cried in a manger would one day cry out from the cross, bearing every sin, every sorrow, every strain we carry now. And the risen Christ

continues to speak into weary hearts: "My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

So take heart this Christmas. The One who came in the quiet of Bethlehem still comes to you now—through His Word, in His Sacraments, and by His Spirit—to steady your steps and strengthen your faith. He is with you in every season of endurance, and He will see you through.

Take time this season to be intentionally with the Lord—whether through our children's Christmas program, our Sunday divine services, our Advent midweek gatherings, or our



Christmas Eve and Christmas Day worship. In all of these moments, the Lord meets you to refresh, refill, and strengthen you in the midst of a tiring holiday season.

May the peace of Christ, who entered our world to redeem it, guard your hearts and sustain you in hope this Christmas and always.

A Simple Advent Wreath for Your Home

As the days grow shorter and the pace of the season grows faster, Advent invites us to slow down, breathe, and remember why we prepare for Christmas in the first place. One simple but meaningful way to do this is by using an Advent wreath at home. This small practice can help families, couples, and individuals pause each week to reflect on Christ's coming and rest in His promises.



You don't need anything elaborate. Four candles—three purple and one pink—are enough, with simple greenery if you choose. Each week of Advent, light the appropriate candle(s), read the Scripture passage, and offer a short prayer. These small moments become touchpoints of hope, peace, joy, and love in the midst of a busy season.

Week 1 - Hope Candle

Light: 1 purple candle Read: Isaiah 9:2, 6–7

Focus: Christ is the promised Light who shines into our darkness.

Prayer: "Lord Jesus, bring hope into our hearts as we wait for Your coming. Amen."

Week 2 - Peace Candle

Light: 2 purple candles Read: Micah 5:2–5a

Focus: God brings peace in unexpected places—even Bethlehem.

Prayer: "Prince of Peace, calm our hearts and help us rest in Your promises. Amen."

Week 3 – Joy Candle

Light: 2 purple candles + the pink candle

Read: Luke 2:8-14

Focus: The angels announce joy for all people—including us today. Prayer: "Lord of joy, fill us with the gladness of the shepherds. Amen."

Week 4 – Love Candle

Light: 3 purple candles + the pink candle

Read: John 1:1-5, 14

Focus: God's love takes on flesh in Jesus, who dwells with us.

Prayer: "God of love, teach us to reflect Christ's love to one another. Amen."

Christmas Day - Christ Candle

If you have a white Christ Candle, place it in the center and light it along with the others.

Read: Luke 2:1-20 or John 1:1-14

Focus: The wait is over—Christ is born for us.

Prayer: "Lord Jesus, Light of the world, dwell in our homes and hearts now and always. Amen."

As you gather around your wreath this Advent, may these brief times of Scripture and prayer become places of rest for your soul. In every candle lit and every promise heard, may Christ draw near to you with His hope, peace, joy, and love.

"PETER'S JOYFUL PERSEVERANCE"

The Tuesday morning Bible class taught by Roy Cordes is taking a Thanksgiving /Christmas/New Year's break and will not be meeting again until **Tuesday, January 6th at 9:45 am** in Fellowship Hall at the downtown church. We are in the middle of II Peter, the letter Peter wrote to new Christians and converted Jews who had dispersed away from Rome due to persecutions by Nero and the Roman government.

In I Peter, the emphasis was on joyful perseverance to help their faith grow strong due to surviving trials and tests. II Peter, written by Peter when he was in jail and awaiting crucifixion, covers living with virtuous qualities to demonstrate our faith and warnings against false teachers in the last days.

In January, we will be finishing II Peter, Chapters 1-3 and the class will continue to meet weekly until the last week in April. Peter's letters are classified as General Epistles meant for a number of churches, including those today, unlike Paul's letters that were written for specific locations. Peter's primary message in II Peter in addition to the Gospel, were informing his readers that the grace of God in Christ truly transforms and empowers Christians to live righteously in the face of opposition. His conclusion is that it results in fruitful lives,

and readers by God's grace will live a life that is pleasing to God.

Please consider starting your New Year with a re-dedication to studying God's Word every day and attend a Bible class or two with your fellow Christians. Studying the Bible in a group once a W-E-E-K makes the devil W-E-A-K in your life!

A regular meeting of the Voters' Assembly will be held on **Sunday, January 25**th at **12:30 pm** at the school. The Church Council will be announcing its selection of qualified voting members who, together with the pastor(s), shall serve as the Nominating Committee. At this meeting, the voters may submit to the committee the names of possible candidates for the various boards. Please contact the church office if you would like more information about the different boards.

Members of the congregation who are age 18 or older are eligible to become voting members and to participate in the decision making of the congregation. After attending at least two Voters' Assembly meetings in a 24-month period, a member may be accepted into voting membership. Voting membership privileges then continue as long as you remain a member of the congregation.




