# THE READING OF THE WORD

Old Testament Lesson: Isaiah 35:1-10 (Everlasting Joy)

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad; the desert shall rejoice and blossom like the crocus; it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who have an anxious heart, "Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then shall the lame man leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy. For waters break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert; the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; in the haunt of jackals, where they lie down, the grass shall become reeds and rushes. 

# Rev. Dr. Allan R. Buss

Rev. Dr. Allan R. Buss was born in Watertown, Wisconsin and grew up working on a dairy farm. He attended St. John Lutheran School in Watertown and graduated from Lakeside Lutheran High School in Lake Mills, Wisconsin in 1982. After graduating from Concordia University Wisconsin in 1986, Rev. Dr. Buss attended Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana, graduating in 1990. He did post graduate studies at Trinity Divinity School in Deerfield, Illinois. In May of 2018 Rev. Dr. Buss was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree from CUWAA.

In his over 30 years of parish ministry Rev. Dr. Buss served two congregations: St. Peter Lutheran



Church, Gilberts, Illinois, and Immanuel Lutheran Church, Belvidere, Illinois. He has also served The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and the LCMS Northern Illinois District in a variety of leadership positions. He was elected as President of the LCMS Northern Illinois District in 2018 and re-elected 2022 and 2025.

Rev. Dr. Buss has participated in mission trips to Kenya, Ethiopia, and Belize. He currently serves on the Boards of Regents of Concordia University Chicago. He and his wife Marie reside in Belvidere, Illinois where he serves as the Fire Department Chaplain for the city. He has four children. All six members of his immediate family have graduated from the Concordia University System, five from CUWAA.
