INVOCATION, CONFESSION AND ASSURANCE OF PARDON

P: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: **Amen.** *Matthew 28:19b*

P: To us a child is born, to us a son is given;

C: **and the government shall be upon His shoulder.** *Isaiah 9:6*

P: Oh sing to the LORD a new song,

C: **for He has done marvelous things!** *Psalms 98:1*

P: Dear Friends in Christ, each week, through the ministry of God's holy Church and the power of His Word, the forgiveness of sins is offered to you and to millions throughout the world. Let us now examine our hearts to see how faithfully we have received and carried forth this great gift of God.
(A brief silence to reflect upon your sins)

P: Let us confess our sin to God our Father. . . Most merciful God,

C: **We confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not responded to Your love in joyful and daily thanksgiving. We cannot save ourselves; therefore, for Jesus’ sake, forgive us, bless us, and increase joy and gladness in us until we sing Your praises with the heavenly host. Amen.**

P: As a called and ordained servant of the Word, I speak God’s Good News to you when I say that no matter how often or how grievously you have sinned, God's power to save is greater! His Son paid the ransom for your bondage to sin with His own life. His love purifies you and leads you into the greatest fellowship the world has ever known, His family of believers. Rejoice then, for in His stead and at His command, I forgive you all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

THE READING OF THE WORD

Old Testament Lesson: Psalm 98:1-6 *(Make A Joyful Noise To The Lord)*

Oh sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things! His right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him. The Lord has made known his salvation; he has revealed his righteousness in the sight of the nations. He has remembered his steadfast love and faithfulness to the house of Israel. All the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God. Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises! Sing praises to the Lord with the lyre, with the lyre and the sound of melody! With trumpets and the sound of the horn make a joyful noise before the King, the Lord!


After worship prayer
