I am aware that some of you are not fond of the furniture in the atrium prior to the rummage sales. The Board of Trustees and the Joseph Ministry are working to rectify this situation. We have cleared and painted the basement rooms in the Mission and Ministry Center to be used for VBS and medical equipment storage, and we are also in the process of cleaning out the southwest upstairs classroom. We will be having the asbestos tile removed, painting walls, and installing a new floor so that rummage sale items can be stored there until the sale. Please be aware of the impact that this sale has on our community and our church. A group of volunteers transport unneeded belongings from church members, and those in the community, regularly to the Center where, every week, the rummage sale volunteers price and sort them so that they can be distributed to those in need at little cost. The exposure of our church to Kankakee County is priceless. Many thousands of hours are invested in the twice-annual sales, and many thousands of dollars are earned to be used for Center improvements and maintenance, communion supplies, altar paraments, robes, and candles. LCMS Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) training will help you focus on the most important thing to remember as you prepare for or respond to a disaster in your community or beyond. At the center of our LERT volunteer training is one thing: **MERCY!** Christ's mercy is the basis for everything we say and do. This training event will equip you to be an effective volunteer should a disaster strike your community.

LERT training is also now offered to youth, ages 14 – 17, so they can also assist in general disaster response safely and under the guidance of their own youth leadership. LCMS Disaster Response has developed new guidelines for youth participation. A parent must be present and sign forms for participation.

The registration cost for new LERT volunteers will be \$35.00. The registration fee can be paid online with a credit card or at the event when you check-in by cash, check or credit card.
