THE SERVING CHRIST:
GOSPEL OF MARK

When: Every Tuesday, 9:45 am

According to Mark in his opening chapters of the Gospel, everything Jesus did at the start of His ministry was questioned by the Pharisees and other church leaders. If he was asked to heal someone, first He forgave their sins, and then physically healed them. His disciples "worked" on the Sabbath. Where did He get His authority to forgive sins? They were constantly challenging Him when He started His ministry in Galilee.

As we study the Gospel we find out that Jesus put an emphasis on a teaching and healing ministry. By healing He meant healing people both spiritually and physically. His baptism demonstrated that He was the Son of God, but the Pharisees either didn't see it or were too vain to believe it.

Sometimes we can't believe what God does for us and we also may know someone who doesn't give God credit for any blessings they have received. Mark shares with us one story after another to help us tell the story of salvation. If you would like to learn your day-to-day role as a Christian who follows Jesus, the study of the Gospels can be a great source of information for your daily walk with the LORD. Many thousands of hours are invested in the twice-annual sales, and many thousands of dollars are earned to be used for Mission & Ministry Center improvements and maintenance, communion supplies, altar paraments, robes, and candles. In the chaos of disaster, it's important to stay focused on the task at hand. LCMS Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) training will help you focus on the most important thing to remember as you prepare for or respond to a disaster in your community or beyond. At the center of our LERT volunteer training is one thing: **MERCY!** Christ's mercy is the basis for everything we say and do. This training event will equip you to be an effective volunteer should a disaster strike your community.

LERT training is also now offered to youth, ages 14 – 17, so they can also assist in general disaster response safely and under the guidance of their own youth leadership. LCMS Disaster Response has developed new guidelines for youth participation. A parent must be present and sign forms for participation.

The registration cost for new LERT volunteers will be \$35.00. The registration fee can be paid online with a credit card or at the event when you check-in by cash, check or credit card.
