IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Wednesday, February 18th, marks the beginning of the season of Lent in the Church Year. Lent is the 40-day season of the Church Year that culminates in Good Friday, the day we observe the crucifixion of Jesus our Savior. Because of this, the season of Lent has historically been a very somber one, marked with themes of spiritual preparation and repentance.

One Lenten practice that is fairly common is the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. Like other Lenten practices, this is not something we are commanded to do, but many choose to do it because it is a reminder of their sinfulness, as well as the salvation we have because Jesus died for our sins. Receiving the ashes does not make one a better Christian, but it can be a reminder to ourselves (as we look in the mirror and at one another), that not only are we sinful people, but we are also people redeemed by the cross of Jesus Christ our Savior.

If you are unable to come to the evening service at 7 pm downtown, you are welcome to join us for the school chapel service at 8:30 am.



LENTEN DEVOTIONS

In love, God sent His Son to redeem the world. In hatred, He was rejected.

In ***Behold Your King!***, we see the Savior stripped of His dignity, led away, and crucified on our behalf. No one could imagine this Man, this condemned and forsaken Man, was God in the flesh sent to liberate us from our sin by His death and resurrection.

That the Son of God joined us in our frail state of humanity is testament to God's overwhelming love and concern for the world. And not only this, Jesus endured scorn and derision from His creation, His earthly subjects. And yet, as King, as Lord of all, He did the unthinkable: He laid down His life for the sins of the world.

GOSPEL OF MARK

Jesus' early ministry around Galilee featured teaching, prayer and healing. The first 3 chapters of Mark provide us with an example to follow today, and then in the 4th chapter He starts teaching using parables. People were coming from all over the region and beyond as His popularity increased each day of His ministry.

The twelve disciples were being trained for their ministries and were always amazed at how Jesus handled those who were opposed to Him like the Scribes, Pharisees and Sadducees. The world can be opposed to you if you choose to follow Jesus, and Mark's Gospel can give you lessons on how to compete with an immoral society.

Many thousands of hours are invested in the twice-annual sales, and many thousands of dollars are earned to be used for Mission & Ministry Center improvements and maintenance, communion supplies, altar paraments, robes, and candles. In the chaos of disaster, it's important to stay focused on the task at hand. LCMS Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT) training will help you focus on the most important thing to remember as you prepare for or respond to a disaster in your community or beyond. At the center of our LERT volunteer training is one thing: MERCY! Christ's mercy is the basis for everything we say and do. This training event will equip you to be an effective volunteer should a disaster strike your community.

LERT training is also now offered to youth, ages 14 – 17, so they can also assist in general disaster response safely and under the guidance of their own youth leadership. LCMS Disaster Response has developed new guidelines for youth participation. A parent must be present and sign forms for participation.

The registration cost for new LERT volunteers will be \$35.00. The registration fee can be paid online with a credit card or at the event when you check-in by cash, check or credit card.
